

Bone Health & Osteoporosis: What You Need to Know


Osteoporosis is a disease in which the bones become weak and fragile, leading to an increased risk of breaking a bone even after a minor fall or bump. This silent disease impacts women and men from all racial groups, and because there are no obvious symptoms, many people don't know they have osteoporosis until they suffer a fracture, which can be lifealtering, robbing people of their independence and quality of life.


Osteoporosis Is Common



1 in 2 women and 1 in 4 men over the age of 50 in the US will break a bone due to osteoporosis.¹

More people suffer fractures due to osteoporosis than heart attack, stroke and breast cancer combined.³





84% of older Americans who suffer bone breaks are not tested or treated for osteoporosis.²

Osteoporosis Is Serious & Costly

There are 2 million preventable fractures a year in the US at a cost of over \$20 billion.²





25% of hip fracture patients die within a year.⁴

1 in 3 people who lived independently before a hip fracture spend a year or more in a nursing home afterward.



40% of hip fracture sufferers are unable to walk independently a year later.⁵



Florida is home to approximately 4.7 million women and 4.1 million men over the age of 50,6 this means that approximately 3 million Floridians are estimated to be at risk of breaking a bone due to osteoporosis. Each day in the Tampa Bay Area, approximately 44 osteoporosis-related fractures occur in women aged 65 years and older.
